Assessment, progression and award

5. Candidates may apply to be allowed to resit a written examination and/or to resubmit an assessed essay in August of the year following admission to the programme.
6. Candidates are required to study and be assessed in modules marked with a Ω unless an exemption from so doing has been granted by the Director of the LLM Programmes.
7. Modules marked with ~ must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated..
8. Optional modules are subject to availability and timetable compatibility. Not all of the optional modules will run every year.
